The nearly 200,000 Army Reserve Soldiers are trained, equipped and organized to perform a wide spectrum of operations that includes DSCA.

The Army Reserve has established four DSCA lines of effort (Policy, Strategic Communications, Operations, and Education/Training) which support the Chief of the Army Reserve's (CAR) DSCA Vision.

The Army Reserve is pre-deployed with over 1,100 facilities located throughout the United States and territories.

USAR has force structure in all three force packages (2100 Soldiers) of the CBRN Response Enterprise (CRE).

The CRE is a multi-component DoD entity that responds in the event of a catastrophic CBRN accident/incident, to conduct direct life-saving and critical life-saving enabling DSCA tasks.

The Army Reserve is part of a tiered response guided by the National Response Framework and maintains demand based DSCA mission, critical dual usage (CDU) capabilities to include: Quartermaster; Engineer; Transportation; Aviation; Chemical; Medical; and Signal
