# 3 WAYS TO REPORT SEXUAL HARASSMENT

REPORTING OPTIONS

- » FORMALLY in writing on DA Form 7746
- » INFORMALLY to SARC IAW AR 600-20
- » ANONYMOUSLY by any means from an unidentified complainant IAW AR 600–20

Formal complaint will be investigated with an AR 15-6 investigation.

# REPORTING OPTIONS FOR SEXUAL ASSAULT

#### » RESTRICTED

Contact SARC, VAs. Medical Personnel

- Provides access to medical services
- Does not involve CID or command involvement

#### » UNRESTRICTED

Contact SARC, VAs, Command Authorities, Medical personnel

- Provides access to medical services
- CID initiate investigation
- Supported by Chain of Command

## BYSTANDER INTERVENTION PROCESS

- 1. Notice event
- 2. Interpret the event as a problem
- 3. Accept personal responsibility
- 4. Decide how to intervene using the 3Ds
- » DIRECT: Address the perpetrator; remove people from the situation
  - » DISTRACT: Change the subject;
  - ask someone to do something;
  - mention someone is coming

    » DELEGATE: Arrange for someone to
  - intervene or take people out of the situation
- 5. Take Action.



# COMMANDER'S 11 LINE ACTION PLAN SEXUAL ASSAULT RESPONSE

STEPS

- Ensure victim's safety. Protect the victim. Determine if alleged offender still at large. Seek emergency medical care if needed.
- **7** Advise victim to preserve evidence.
- Notify SARC, Victim's Advocate,
  Medical Center
- Immediately notify CID, local law enforcement, SJA, and Chain of Command within 24 hours. Do not initiate a 15–6.
- Preserve evidence by establishing perimeter on area until CID/Local law enforcement arrives.
  Store clothes in paper bags.
- Submit SAIRO within 8 days.
- 7 Initiate LOD with Sexual Assault Response Coordinator Assistance.
- Determine if military protective order (MPO) is needed.
- Determine right to expedited transfer.
- 14 day initial follow-up conducted (SA).
- 45 day final notification conducted (SA).
