
WAR IN AFGHANISTAN

Since the 2012 National Defense Authorization Act, Army Reserve Soldiers have responded to disasters and emergencies, such as Superstorm Sandy and severe flooding in Rainelle, W. Va. More than 40 Defense Support of Civil Authorities (DSCA) missions have been supported.
