#### **BGCA/Military Partnership History**



#### 1906

The Federated Boys Clubs in Boston was formed with 53 member organizations – this marked the start of a nationwide Movement and our national organization.

#### **Our Mission:**

To enable all young people, especially those who need us most, to reach their full potential as productive, caring, responsible citizens.

- Military partnership 1991 during the Persian Gulf War.
  - 2022 was the 30<sup>th</sup> anniversary of our partnership.

#### **BGCA/Military Partnership History**



- By 1995 the Military solidified its partnership with BGCA
  - On-Installation: 213 BGCA-affiliated youth centers/500 sites worldwide.
- In 2013 Mission: Youth Outreach was started to connect geographically-dispersed families to local Boys & Girls Clubs.
  - Off-Installation: We have 1120 organizations and over 5,100 sites across the United States.
- Since 2016 BGCA partnered to improve the lives of military families in civilian communities.
- Called the "Better Together" partnership, this ground-breaking public-private collaboration is focused on taking action to support military youth and their families.

## Mission: Youth Outreach (MYO) Program for Army Reserve Families



#### WHAT IS IT?

- Voucher/application process with a \$238 value
- Provides annual membership to a participating local Boys & Girls Club organization
- For all kids 6-18
- Can be renewed every year
- Can be transferred if relocation occurs

#### IS THERE A COST?

- Each Club is its own non-profit organization | Federated Model
- 89% of all Boys & Girls Club organizations' annual membership is under \$238
- There may be additional fees for transportation, summer, monthly, etc.
- Local scholarships are available from the Club if membership exceeds \$238

## Mission: Youth Outreach (MYO) Program for Army Reserve Families



#### **ELIGIBILITY:**

- Ages 6-18
- Dependent youth living geo-dispersed
- Biological, Step, Foster, Guardian, Adoptive
- Active-Duty, Guard & Reserve families only

#### **BEFORE SCHOOL:**

- Some Clubs open early to support working families
- Some are child-care providers (0-5), but these are not MYO eligible
  - This changes, so will need to call local Club to see about hours, etc.
- Most can be drop-in if registered in advance

#### **AFTER SCHOOL:**

- Most can be drop-in if registered in advance
- Some Clubs open on Saturdays
  - This changes, so will need to call local Club to see about hours, etc.
- Some Clubs open late, but typically close between 5 7pm
