

1. Travel within Host Nation.

a. The local leave and pass area is currently deemed to include the entire area inside the host nation's borders. This means as a baseline measure, leave, pass, or other unofficial travel by Service Members inside their resident host nation's borders is authorized.

b. Subordinate commanders retain the discretion to impose more restrictive leave and pass policies.

2. International Travel. The following DoD and EUCOM guidance applies only to **unofficial travel**. Due to rapidly changing conditions, all individuals must remain aware of the possibility that countries may impose quarantines, close borders, or otherwise restrict movement with little or no warning, during their travel or upon return.

a. Only Service Members stationed, assigned, or attached to the following installations may travel internationally:

-USAG Rheinland-Pfalz

b. Service Members stationed, assigned, or attached to the installations listed in paragraph 2a may travel internationally from, to or through the following countries:

c. At this time, DoD and USEUCOM policy require General Officer/Senior Executive Service approval **for all** leave, pass, and other unofficial travel across all international borders by Service Members stationed, assigned, or attached to the following installations.

-USAG BENELUX (Belgium, Netherlands, Luxembourg)
-ASG Black Sea (Romania, Bulgaria, Greece)
-ASG Balkans (Kosovo)
