**Psychological Operations Specialist (37F)**  
 Army Reserve Psychological Operations Specialists are experts at persuasion and influence. They specialize in the planning, analysis, development, design, dissemination, and evaluation of PSYOP across the competition continuum.

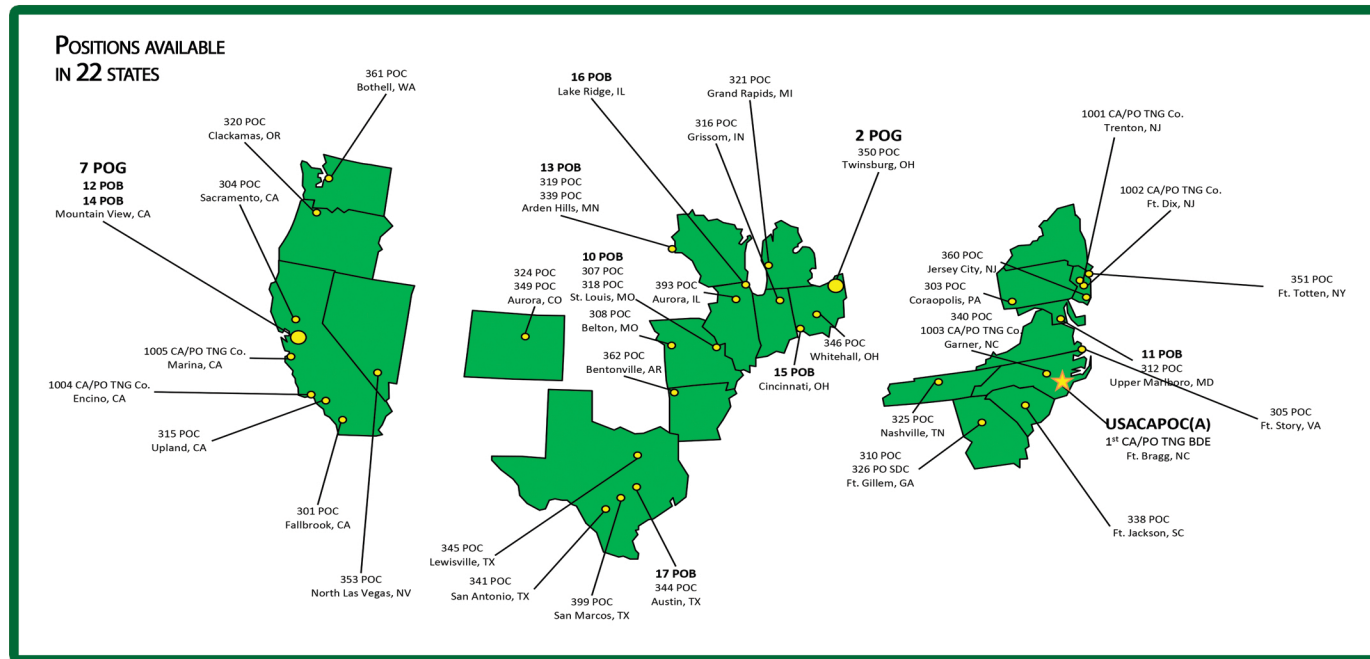
**Military Occupational Specialty Training:**  
 1 - 37F Initial Entry (Skill Level 1, Non-Prior Service):  
 - 10 weeks of Basic Training  
 - 10 weeks of Advanced Individual Training (AIT)  
 2 - 37F Reclassification course: 29 days  
 (open to USAR Staff Sergeant / E-6 and below)

**Additional Qualifications / Requirements:**  
 - Minimum Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery (ASVAB) ST score of 101 after 01 July 2004 or GT score of 105 after 01 July 2020  
 - Have a Physical Profile Serial System PULHES 111221  
 - SECRET security clearance eligibility  
 - Normal color vision

**Psychological Operations (PSYOP) Officer (37A)**  
 Army Reserve Psychological Operations officers plan, coordinate and manage the execution of psychological operations, understand the human domain and operations conducted within, are proficient in tactical-level operations, are capable of planning and conducting Military Information Support Operations (MISO) at the tactical, operational and strategic levels, and are experts in the psychological aspects of warfare and influence.

**Officer PSYOP Branch Qualification Training:**  
 1 - Prior branch Captains Career Course (CCC)  
 2 - Psychological Operations Captains Career Course  
 - Phase I (Resident) - 4 Days  
 (if no prior completed CCC)  
 - Phase 2 (Non-Resident) - 18 week facilitated distance learning  
 - Phase 3 (Resident) - 29 Days

**Special Qualifications / Requirements:**  
 - Obtain rank of First Lieutenant or Captain  
 - Have a Physical Profile Serial System PULHES 111221  
 - Top Secret (TS) clearance eligibility

You will assess and develop the information needed to inform, educate, persuade, direct, and influence foreign audiences and populations. As part of the largest component of trained and equipped forces capable of conducting Military Information Support Operations (MISO) in the U.S. Army, you'll broadcast important information through various mediums to directly and indirectly engage foreign governments, militaries, and civilian populations.
