CIVIL AFFAIRS SPECIALIST (38B)

Army Reserve Civil Affairs Specialists conduct, coordinate, participate in, and supervise the analysis, planning, and production of civil affairs related products and resources for tactical civil affairs operations.

MOS TRAINING:

- 1 - 38B Initial Entry: 23 weeks
 - 10 weeks of Basic Training
 - 11 weeks of Advanced Individual Training (AIT)
- 2 - 38B Reclassification course: 29 days (open to USAR Staff Sergeant / E-6 and below)

Additional Qualifications / Requirements:

- A minimum score of 100 in aptitude area ST on Armed Service Vocational Aptitude Battery (ASVAB) tests administered prior to 02 Jan 2002 or a minimum ST score of 96 on ASVAB tests on or after 02 Jan 2002. No ST score required after 01 Feb 2015.
- A minimum score of 107 in aptitude area GT effective 01 Feb 2015.
- Have a Physical Profile Serial System (PULHES) 111221
- SECRET security clearance eligibility

CIVIL AFFAIRS OFFICER (38A)


Civil Affairs officers engage civil components within a military operational area and enhance, enable, or provide governance to gain and maintain influence, consolidate military gains, and create effects.

Officer CA Branch Qualification Training

- 1 - Prior branch Captains Career Course (CCC)
- 2 - Civil Affairs Captains Career Course
 - Phase 1 (Resident) - 4 Days (if no prior completed CCC)
 - Phase 2 (Resident) - 10 Days
 - Phase 3 (Resident) - 14 Days

Special Qualifications / Requirements:

- Obtain rank of First Lieutenant, Captain, or Major (with grade waiver)
- Have a Physical Profile Serial System PULHES 111221
- Top Secret (TS) clearance eligibility



Army Reserve Civil Affairs (CA) Soldiers have a unique mission and are trained in both tactical skills and the understanding of the civil-social dynamics and populace behaviors that can affect military operations. Often called "Warrior-Diplomats," CA Soldiers use their understanding of the civil component to inform and influence military operations by working directly with indigenous populations, civil institutions, interagency organizations, and unified action partners. CA Soldiers are called upon to exercise critical thinking skills, cultural analysis, the use of negotiation techniques, and many other tasks. Civil Affairs is an integral part of the Army's current and future strategy to prevent, shape, and win future conflicts. "Secure the Victory!"
